Did you know it is a state and federal law to provide a Plan of Safe Care (POSC) to your perinatal patients who are substance-exposed?



According to the State of New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services, medical providers are responsible for developing the POSC with their patients. It must be put into place prior to discharge after birth.
