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It May be Time for Your Patients to Verify Their Medicaid Eligibility

Continuous Medicaid Coverage Has Ended

The COVID-19 federal public health emergency providing continuous Medicaid coverage has ended. Your patients have/will receive letters from DHHS including the date by when they must verify their Medicaid eligibility. If they do not verify their Medicaid eligibility by the date in their DHHS yellow letter, they will lose health coverage.

Please note: Be sure your patients wait until their redetermination month (will be noted on their letter or NHEasy account) to take action. Completing too early may result in errors or even cause immediate ineligibility for Medicaid coverage.

It covers the basic skills of interviewing, reviews standardized tools to assess for risk factors of suicide and evidenced based tools to assess risk of suicide.
